What's New in this Update:

As always, non-stop changes continue to alter the relocation/immigration landscape. Among other developments in recent months are the implementation of the Comprehensive and Progressive Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP) providing free trade benefits, including immigration elements for some eleven pacific rim countries. The United States, initially part of the negotiations is not part of this free trade arrangement, but other countries, including Canada and Mexico have implemented it. Other countries include Australia, Japan, New Zealand, and Singapore, among others. The immigration elements of the CPTPP are now canvassed in Chapter 5.
