This service will keep subscribers up-to-date on a weekly basis with the status in both the House of Commons and the Senate of Bills introduced in the current parliamentary session. It is divided into the following four sections:

NEW THIS WEEK records the latest stage reached by a Bill during the week's proceedings. The section lists all Bills that in the past week have received either first, second or third reading, been reported from Committee, received Royal Assent, or been brought into force. Because they rarely become law, Private Members' Public Bills are not noted here until they pass second reading. Private

Members' Private Bills are not noted in this Bulletin Service at all. The information in this section is always repeated in the STATUS OF BILLS section.

STATUS AND SUMMARY OF BILLS alphabetically lists and reports the status of all Bills that are either currently before Parliament or that have received Royal Assent. A summary of each Bill is provided, where available. The date of coming into force is noted on its occurrence. Bills prefaced by the letter "C" originate in the House of Commons; those prefaced by the letter "S" originate in the Senate. This section is cumulative for the current session.

CONSEQUENTIAL AMENDMENTS lists Acts affected by amendments within the copy of the source Bill that has received Royal Assent. The Acts that are amended in consequence will be listed in alphabetical order in this section as soon as we receive the Royal Assent copy of the source Bill. The reader is then referred, in abbreviated format, to the source Bill which contains the amendment. This source Bill will be found in the "STATUS OF BILLS" section, in alphabetical order. This section is cumulative for the current session.

An Act respecting First Nations, Inuit and Métis children, youth and families (Bill C-92) — (SI/2019-96) January 1, 2020 is fixed as the day on which the Act comes into force.

Budget Implementation Act, 2018, No. 2 (Bill C-86) — (SI/2019-92) The day on which this Order is made is fixed as the day on which Div. 19 of Pt. 4 of the Act comes into force.

Budget Implementation Act, 2019, No. 1 (Bill C-97) — (SI/2019-95) The day on which this Order is made is fixed as the day on which ss. 328 to 331 of the Act come into force.

First Nations Fiscal Management Act, S.C. 2005, c. 9 — (SOR/2019-324) The schedule to the Act is amended by deleting the following: Mohawks of Akwesasne; Order in force on the day on which it is registered.

Indigenous Languages Act (Bill C-91) — (SI/2019-93) The day after the day on which this Order is made as the day on which ss. 1 to 11, 13, 13.1, 16, 18 and 19 of the Act come into force; and the earlier of October 1, 2020 and the day on which a Commissioner is appointed under s. 13 of the Act as the day on which ss. 12, 14, 15, 17 and 20 to 49.1 of the Act come into force.

STATUS AND SUMMARY OF CURRENT BILLS

(Note: New entries are in bold-face.)

Aboriginal Languages of Canada Act (Bill S-212) Senate 2nd Reading December 1, 2016. *Summary: This enactment recognizes the right of the aboriginal peoples of Canada to use, preserve, revitalize and promote their languages, and expresses the Government of Canada's commitment to preserve, revitalize and promote aboriginal languages in Canada by protecting them and using them where appropriate.*

Accessible Canada Act (Bill C-81) Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 10. The Act, other than s. 206, come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2019-55) July 11, 2019 is fixed as the day on which the Act comes into force, other than s. 206, which came into force on assent. *Summary: This enactment enacts the Accessible Canada Act in order to enhance the full and equal participation of all persons, especially persons with disabilities, in society. This is to be achieved through the progressive realization, within the purview of matters coming within the legisla-*

tive authority of Parliament, of a Canada without barriers, particularly by the identification, removal and prevention of barriers.

An Act respecting certain payments to be made out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund (Bill C-94). Commons 1st Reading March 20, 2019. *Summary: This enactment authorizes payments to be made out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund in relation to infrastructure as well as to the Federation of Canadian Municipalities and to the Shock Trauma Air Rescue Service.*

An Act respecting First Nations, Inuit and Métis children, youth and families (Bill C-92) Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 24. The Act come into force on a day or days to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2019-96) January 1, 2020 is fixed as the day on which the Act comes into force. *Summary: This enactment affirms the rights and jurisdiction of Indigenous peoples in relation to child and family services and sets out principles applicable, on a national level, to the provision of child and family services in relation to Indigenous children, such as the best interests of the child, cultural continuity and substantive equality.*

An Act respecting the administration of oaths of office (Bill C-1) Commons 1st Reading December 4, 2015.

An Act to amend An Act to amend the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act, the Civil Marriage Act and the Criminal Code and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill S-210) Royal Assent: S.C. 2018, c. 15; in force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment amends An Act to amend the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act, the Civil Marriage Act and the Criminal Code and to make consequential amendments to other Acts by repealing its short title.*

An Act to amend certain Acts and Regulations in relation to firearms (Bill C-71). Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 9. Sections 1, 3(2), 4(2), 16, 18 to 21 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Section 2 comes into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Sections 4(3), 6, 8 and 15 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Sections 5, 9 to 11, 13(1) come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Sections 7, 13(3), 14 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, but that day must not be before the day referred to in subsection (4). *Summary: art 1 of this Act amends the Firearms Act to, among other things, (a) remove the reference to the five-year period, set out in subsection 5(2) of that Act, that applies to the mandatory consideration of certain eligibility criteria for holding a licence; (b) require, when a non-restricted firearm is transferred, that the transferee's firearms licence be verified by the Registrar of Firearms and that businesses keep certain information related to the transfer; and (c) remove certain automatic authorizations to transport prohibited and restricted firearms. Part 1 also amends the Criminal Code to repeal the authority of the Governor in Council to prescribe by regulation that a prohibited or restricted firearm be a non-restricted firearm or that a prohibited firearm be a restricted firearm and, in consequence, the Part (a) repeals certain provisions of regulations made under the Criminal Code; and (b)*

amends the Firearms Act to grandfather certain individuals and firearms, including firearms previously prescribed as restricted or non-restricted firearms in those provisions. Furthermore, Part 1 amends section 115 of the Criminal Code to clarify that firearms and other things seized and detained by, or surrendered to, a peace officer at the time a prohibition order referred to in that section is made are forfeited to the Crown. Part 2, among other things, (a) amends the Ending the Long-gun Registry Act, by repealing the amendments made by the Economic Action Plan 2015 Act, No. 1, to retroactively restore the application of the Access to Information Act and the Privacy Act to the records related to the registration of non-restricted firearms until the day on which this enactment receives royal assent; (b) provides that the Access to Information Act and the Privacy Act continue to apply to proceedings that were initiated under those Acts before that day until the proceedings are finally disposed of, settled or abandoned; and (c) directs the Commissioner of Firearms to provide the minister of the Government of Quebec responsible for public security with a copy of such records, at that minister's request.

An Act to amend the Access to Information Act and the Privacy Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill C-58) Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 18. Sections 12, 14, 16, 17 and 19 to 21, s. 22(2) and ss. 23 to 27, 29, 30, 36, 38, 48, 52, 53 and 60 come into force on the first anniversary of the day on which this Act receives royal assent. *Summary: This enactment amends the Access to Information Act, amends the Privacy Act. It also makes consequential amendments to the Canada Evidence Act and the Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act.*

An Act to amend the Air Canada Public Participation Act and to provide for certain other measures (Bill C-10) Royal Assent June 22, 2016: S.C. 2016, c. 8. *Summary: This enactment amends the Air Canada Public Participation Act to provide that Air s articles of continuance contain a requirement that it carry out aircraft maintenance activities in Ontario, Quebec and Manitoba and to provide for certain other measures related to that obligation.*

An Act to amend the Borrowing Authority Act (S-246). Senate 2nd Reading November 27, 2018. *Summary: This enactment amends the Borrowing Authority Act to limit the circumstances in which the Governor in Council may authorize the borrowing of money without legislative approval.*

An Act to amend the Canada Border Services Agency Act (Inspector General of the Canada Border Services Agency) and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill S-205) Passed Senate October 25, 2016. *Summary: This enactment provides for the appointment of an Inspector General of the Canada Border Services Agency with the authority to report on and make recommendations concerning the s activities and the capacity to receive and investigate complaints about the Agency.*

An Act to amend the Canada Business Corporations Act, the Canada Cooperatives Act, the Canada Not-for-profit Corporations Act, and the Competition Act (Bill C-25) Royal Assent May 1, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 8. In force as set out in the Act — (SI/2019-50) January 1, 2020 is fixed as the day on which s.

24 of the Act comes into force. *Summary: Part 1 amends the Canada Business Corporations Act, the Canada Cooperatives Act and the Canada Not-for-profit Corporations Act. Part 2 amends the Competition Act to expand the concept of affiliation to a broader range of business organizations.*

An Act to amend the Canada Elections Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill C-33) Commons 1st Reading November 24, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the Canada Elections Act. In addition, the enactment contains transitional provisions and makes consequential amendments to other Acts.*

An Act to amend the Canada Elections Act (political financing) (Bill C-50) Royal Assent June 20, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 20; Act comes into force on the day that, in the sixth month after the month in which it receives royal assent, has the same calendar number as the day on which it receives royal assent or, if that sixth month has no day with that number, the last day of that sixth month. *Summary: This enactment amends the Canada Elections Act to enact an advertising and reporting regime for fundraising events attended by Ministers, party leaders or leadership contestants; and harmonize the rules applicable to contest expenses of nomination contestants and leadership contestants with the rules applicable to election expenses of candidates.*

An Act to amend the Canada-Israel Free Trade Agreement Implementation Act and to make related amendments to other Acts (Bill C-85) Royal Assent May 27, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 6; Act comes into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2019-77) September 1, 2019 is fixed as the day on which the Act comes into force. *Summary: This enactment amends the Canada-Israel Free Trade Agreement Implementation Act in order to implement the Canada-Israel Free Trade Amending Protocol 2018 signed on May 28, 2018. In order to modernize the text of the Act and by that reflect the amendments brought about by the Protocol, this enactment repeals the preamble to that Act and amends the definition of Agreement, the provision setting out the purpose of the Act and the provisions related to the operation of the institutional and administrative aspects of the Agreement. It also amends that Act in order to confer on the Governor in Council the power to make orders in accordance with the amended Agreement. Finally, the enactment amends certain Acts to bring them into conformity with Canada's obligations resulting from the amendments brought about by the Protocol.*

An Act to amend the Canada Labour Code (harassment and violence), the Parliamentary Employment and Staff Relations Act and the Budget Implementation Act, 2017, No. 1 (Bill C-65) Royal Assent October 25, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 22; In force as set out in the Act. *Summary: Part 1 of this enactment amends the Canada Labour Code to strengthen the existing framework for the prevention of harassment and violence, including sexual harassment and sexual violence, in the work place. Part 2 amends Part III of the Parliamentary Employment and Staff Relations Act with respect to the application of Part II of the Canada Labour Code to parliamentary employers and employees, without limiting in any way the powers, privileges and immunities of the Senate*

and the House of Commons and their members. Part 3 amends a transitional provision in the Budget Implementation Act, 2017, No. 1.

- An Act to amend the Canada Labour Code, the Parliamentary Employment and Staff Relations Act, the Public Service Labour Relations Act and the Income Tax Act (Bill C-4) Royal Assent June 19, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 12; Act, other than ss. 12 and 13, come into force on the third day after the day on which royal assent is received. *Summary: This enactment amends the Canada Labour Code, the Parliamentary Employment and Staff Relations Act and the Public Service Labour Relations Act to restore the procedures for the certification and the revocation of certification of bargaining agents that existed before June 16, 2015. It also amends the Income Tax Act to remove from that Act the requirement that labour organizations and labour trusts provide annually to the Minister of National Revenue certain information returns containing specific information that would be made available to the public.*
- An Act to amend the Canada Pension Plan, the Canada Pension Plan Investment Board Act and the Income Tax Act (Bill C-26) Royal Assent December 15, 2016: S.C. 2016, c. 14; in force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2017-19) The Day after the Day on which this Order is made is fixed as the Day on which Part 1 of An Act to amend the Canada Pension Plan, the Canada Pension Plan Investment Board Act and the Income Tax Act Comes into Force — (SI/2017-57) fixed as the day on which ss. 1(1) to (4), (6), (7), (9) and (10) and s. 8 and 13 of that Act come into force. *Summary: Part 1 of this enactment amends the Canada Pension Plan. This Part also amends the Canada Pension Plan Investment Board Act to provide for the transfer of funds between the Investment Board and the Additional Canada Pension Plan Account and to provide for the preparation of financial statements in relation to amounts managed by the Investment Board in relation to the additional contributions and increased benefits. Part 2 makes related amendments to the Income Tax Act to increase the Working Income Tax Benefit and to provide a deduction for additional employee contributions.*
- An Act to amend the Canadian Forces Members and Veterans Re-establishment and Compensation Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill C-12) Commons 1st Reading March 24, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the Canadian Forces Members and Veterans Re-establishment and Compensation Act.*
- An Act to amend the Canadian Human Rights Act and the Criminal Code (Bill C-16) Royal Assent June 19, 2017, S.C. 2017, c. 13; in force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment amends the Canadian Human Rights Act to add gender identity and gender expression to the list of prohibited grounds of discrimination. The enactment also amends the Criminal Code to extend the protection against hate propaganda set out in that Act to any section of the public that is distinguished by gender identity or expression and to clearly set out that evidence that an offence was motivated by bias, prejudice or hate based on gender identity or expression constitutes an aggravating circumstance that a court must take into consideration when it imposes a sentence.*

- An Act to amend the Citizenship Act (C-99) Commons 1st Reading May 28, 2019. *Summary: This enactment amends the Citizenship Act to include, in the Oath or Affirmation of Citizenship, a solemn promise to respect the Aboriginal and treaty rights of First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples.*
- An Act to amend the Citizenship Act and to make consequential amendments to another Act (Bill C-6) Royal Assent June 19, 2017, S.C. 2017, c. 14; Subsections 1(1), (3) and (7) and s. 8 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council; Subsections 1(2) and (4) come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council; Subsections 1(6), (9) and (10) and section 13 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council; Sections 11 and 12 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2018-9) The day this order is made is fixed as the day on which ss. 3(2) and (3) and 4(1) and (3) and s. 5.1 of the Act come into force — (SI/2018-109) December 5, 2018 is fixed as the day on which ss. 11 and 12 of the Act come into force. *Summary: This enactment amends the Citizenship Act to, among other things, (a) remove the grounds for the revocation of Canadian citizenship that relate to national security; (b) remove the requirement that an applicant intend, if granted citizenship, to continue to reside in Canada; (c) reduce the number of days during which a person must have been physically present in Canada before applying for citizenship and provide that, in the calculation of the length of physical presence, the number of days during which the person was physically present in Canada before becoming a permanent resident may be taken into account; (d) limit the requirement to demonstrate knowledge of Canada and of one of its official languages to applicants between the ages of 18 and 54; and (e) authorize the Minister to seize any document that he or she has reasonable grounds to believe was fraudulently or improperly obtained or used or could be fraudulently or improperly used. It also makes consequential amendments to the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act.*
- An Act to amend the Constitution Act, 1867 and the Parliament of Canada Act (Speakership of the Senate) (Bill S-213) Senate reported without amendment March 28, 2017. *Summary: This enactment amends the Constitution Act, 1867 to provide for the election of the Speaker and the Deputy Speaker of the Senate. It further amends the Constitution Act, 1867 to provide for a voting procedure in the Senate similar to the one used in the House of Commons, where the elected Speaker of that House may not vote except when the votes on a question are equally divided. The enactment also makes related amendments to the Parliament of Canada Act.*
- An Act to amend the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act and to make related amendments to other Acts (Bill C-37) Royal Assent May 18, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 7. Subsection 1(1) and s. 28 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, s. 1(6), s. 2, ss. 3(2) and 7(1), (3) and (5), ss. 8 and 10 to 24, s. 26(8), ss. 29, 54, 58 and 59, s. 60(1) and ss. 61, 64 to 68 and 70 to 72 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, ss. 31, 32 and 36 and s. 40(13) come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, but this day must not be before the day

fixed by the Governor in Council under subsection (5), s. 35 comes into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, s. 40(12) comes into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2018-46) the day on which this Order is made is fixed as the day on which s. 1(6), s. 2, ss. 3(2) and 7(1), (3) and (5), ss. 8 and 10 to 24, s. 26(8), ss. 29, 54, 58 and 59, s. 60(1) and ss. 61, 64 to 68 and 70 to 72 of the Act come into force. *Summary: This enactment amends the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. It makes related amendments to the Customs Act and the Proceeds of Crime (Money Laundering) and Terrorist Financing Act to repeal provisions that prevent customs officers from opening mail that weighs 30 grams or less. It also makes other related amendments to the Criminal Code and the Seized Property Management Act.*

- An Act to amend the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act (substances used in the production of fentanyl) (Bill S-225) Passed Senate June 16, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends Part I of Schedule VI to the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act to add certain substances used in the production of fentanyl, so that they will be regulated as Class A precursors.*
- An Act to amend the Copyright Act (access to copyrighted works or other subject-matter for persons with perceptual disabilities) (Bill C-11) Royal Assent June 22, 2016: S.C. 2016, c. 4. *Summary: This enactment amends provisions of the Copyright Act on access for persons with perceptual disabilities to copyrighted materials and, in doing so, implements the Marrakesh Treaty to Facilitate Access to Published Works for Persons Who Are Blind, Visually Impaired, or Otherwise Print Disabled. The amendments facilitate access for such persons to copyrighted materials while ensuring that the interests of copyright owners are safeguarded.*
- An Act to amend the Corrections and Conditional Release Act and another Act (Bill C-83). Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 27. Sections 3, 7, 10, 11, 14, 29, 31(1) come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Sections 12, 15, 16, 18, 21 and 22 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Sections 28, 30 and 31(2) come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2019-88) November 30, 2019 is fixed as the day on which ss. 3, 7, 10, 11, 14, 28 to 30, 31(1) and (2) of the Act come into force. *Summary: This enactment amends the Corrections and Conditional Release Act to, among other things, (a) eliminate the use of administrative segregation and disciplinary segregation; (b) authorize the Commissioner to designate a penitentiary or an area in a penitentiary as a structured intervention unit for the confinement of inmates who cannot be maintained in the mainstream inmate population for security or other reasons; (c) provide less invasive alternatives to physical body cavity searches; (d) affirm that the Correctional Service of Canada has the obligation to support the autonomy and clinical independence of registered health care professionals; (e) provide that the Correctional Service of Canada has the obligation to provide inmates with access to patient advocacy services; (f) provide that the Correctional Service of Canada has an obligation to consider systemic and background factors unique to Indigenous*

offenders in all decision-making; and (g) improve victims' access to audio recordings of parole hearings. This enactment also amends the English version of a provision of the Criminal Records Act.

- An Act to amend the Corrections and Conditional Release Act and the Abolition of Early Parole Act (Bill C-56) Commons 1st Reading June 19, 2017. *Summary: This enactment amends the Corrections and Conditional Release Act. This enactment also amends the Abolition of Early Parole Act to provide that the accelerated parole review process under the Corrections and Conditional Release Act continues to apply to offenders in respect of an offence committed before the day on which the Abolition of Early Parole Act came into force.*
- An Act to amend the Criminal Code and the Department of Justice Act and to make consequential amendments to another Act (Bill C-51) Royal Assent December 13, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 29. In force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to amend, remove or repeal passages and provisions that have been ruled unconstitutional or that raise risks with regard to the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms, as well as passages and provisions that are obsolete, redundant or that no longer have a place in criminal law. It also modifies certain provisions of the Code relating to sexual assault in order to clarify their application and to provide a procedure applicable to the admissibility and use of the complainant's or a witness's record when in the possession of the accused. This enactment also amends the Department of Justice Act to require that the Minister of Justice cause to be tabled, for every government Bill introduced in either House of Parliament, a statement of the potential effects on the rights and freedoms guaranteed by the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms. Finally, it makes consequential amendments to the Criminal Records Act.*
- An Act to amend the Criminal Code and to make related amendments to other Acts (medical assistance in dying) (Bill C-14) Royal Assent June 17, 2016; S.C. 2016, c. 3. Sections 4 and 5 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to, among other things, (a) create exemptions from the offences of culpable homicide, of aiding suicide and of administering a noxious thing, in order to permit medical practitioners and nurse practitioners to provide medical assistance in dying and to permit pharmacists and other persons to assist in the process; (b) specify the eligibility criteria and the safeguards that must be respected before medical assistance in dying may be provided to a person; (c) require that medical practitioners and nurse practitioners who receive requests for, and pharmacists who dispense substances in connection with the provision of, medical assistance in dying provide information for the purpose of permitting the monitoring of medical assistance in dying, and authorize the Minister of Health to make regulations respecting that information; and (d) create new offences for failing to comply with the safeguards, for forging or destroying documents related to medical assistance in dying, for failing to provide the required information and for contravening the regulations. This enactment also makes related amendments to other Acts to en-*

sure that recourse to medical assistance in dying does not result in the loss of a pension under the Pension Act or benefits under the Canadian Forces Members and Veterans Re-establishment and Compensation Act. It amends the Corrections and Conditional Release Act to ensure that no investigation need be conducted under section 19 of that Act in the case of an inmate who receives medical assistance in dying.

- An Act to amend the Criminal Code and the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act (trafficking in human organs) (Bill S-240) Passed Senate. Passed Commons April 30, 2019. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to create new offences in relation to trafficking in human organs and tissue. It also amends the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act to provide that a permanent resident or foreign national is inadmissible to Canada if the Minister of Citizenship and Immigration is of the opinion that they have engaged in any activities relating to trafficking in human organs or tissue.*
- An Act to amend the Criminal Code (bestiality and animal fighting) (Bill C-84) Royal Assent June 21, 2019; S.C. 2019, c. 17. In force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to (a) define ‘bestiality’; (b) expand the scope of the offence of encouraging, aiding or assisting at the fighting or baiting of animals or birds so that the offence (i) includes promoting, arranging, receiving money for or taking part in the fighting or baiting of animals or birds, and (ii) also applies with respect to the training, transporting or breeding of animals or birds for fighting or baiting; and (c) expand the scope of the offence of building, making, maintaining or keeping a cockpit so that the offence applies with respect to any arena for animal fighting.*
- An Act to amend the Criminal Code (criminal interest rate) (Bill S-237) Senate reported with amendments February 13, 2018. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to reduce the criminal rate of interest from sixty per cent to the Bank of Canada’s overnight rate plus twenty per cent on credit advanced for certain purposes, which would include personal, family and household purposes. It maintains the criminal rate at sixty per cent on credit advanced for business or commercial purposes. However, business or commercial agreements under which the credit advanced equals or exceeds one million dollars are exempt from the offence of charging a criminal rate of interest.*
- An Act to amend the Criminal Code (detention in custody) (Bill S-217). Passed Senate. Commons 2nd Reading March 8, 2017. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to (a) expand the grounds for the justification of detention in custody; (b) require that, in any proceeding under section 515, the prosecutor lead evidence to prove the fact that the accused has failed to appear in court when required to do so and the fact that the accused has previously been convicted of a criminal offence or has been charged with and is awaiting trial for another criminal offence; and (c) require that a court, when exercising its discretion to grant credit for time spent in custody in determining the sentence to be imposed on a person convicted of an offence, consider the reasons for detaining the person in custody.*

- An Act to amend the Criminal Code (exploitation and trafficking in persons) (Bill C-38) Commons 1st Reading February 9, 2017. *Summary: This enactment amends An Act to amend the Criminal Code (exploitation and trafficking in persons) so that certain sections of that Act can come into force on different days.*
- An Act to amend the Criminal Code (independence of the judiciary) and to make related amendments (S-251) Senate 2nd Reading November 27, 2018. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to give a court the discretion to vary the punishment to be imposed in respect of an offence for which the punishment or different degrees or kinds of punishment is prescribed in an enactment. It allows a court to decide to not make a mandatory prohibition order provided for under a provision of that Act, or to add conditions or vary any of the conditions set out in that provision, if the court considers it just and reasonable to do so. It requires the court to provide its reasons for making such a decision. It requires a court to consider all available options prior to imposing a minimum punishment of imprisonment or period of parole ineligibility under a provision of that Act, and to provide written reasons for imposing a minimum punishment of imprisonment or period of parole ineligibility. It gives a court discretion in the treatment or counselling program that a person who has been found guilty of an offence may attend and removes the requirement for the Attorney General to give his or her consent in order to delay sentencing under subsection 720(2) of that Act. It further provides that a court may order the payment of a victim surcharge in an amount lower than that set out in subsection 737(2) of that Act or order that no victim surcharge be imposed if the court considers it appropriate in the circumstances and is satisfied that the amount set out in that subsection cannot be paid. It requires the court to provide its reasons for making such an order. It provides that a judge is to take into consideration the recommendation of the jury in setting the period of parole ineligibility of a person who has been found guilty of first or second degree murder. Lastly, it makes related amendments.*
- An Act to amend the Criminal Code (inflicting torture) (Bill C-242) Commons 2nd Reading April 21, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to create the offence, for a private individual, of inflicting torture. It also amends other provisions of the Act as a consequence.*
- An Act to amend the Criminal Code (offences relating to conveyances) and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill C-46) Royal Assent June 21, 2018; S.C. 2018, c. 21; Sections 12 to 50 of the Act come into force on the 180th day after the day on which royal assent is received. *Summary: Part 1 amends the provisions of the Criminal Code that deal with offences and procedures relating to drug-impaired driving. Part 2 repeals the provisions of the Criminal Code that deal with offences and procedures relating to conveyances, including those provisions enacted by Part 1, and replaces them with provisions in a new Part of the Criminal Code. Part 3 contains coordinating amendments and the coming into force provision.*

- An Act to amend the Criminal Code (passive detection device) (Bill C-247) Commons 2nd Reading September 28, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to authorize the use by a peace officer of a passive detection device to detect the presence of alcohol in the immediate vicinity of a person whom the officer has reasonable grounds to believe was, within the preceeding three hours, operating a motor vehicle or having the care or control of a motor vehicle. The enactment also provides that if such a device indicates the presence of alcohol, it establishes reasonable grounds to suspect that the person has alcohol in their body.*
- An Act to amend the Criminal Code (protection of children against standard child-rearing violence) (Bill S-206) Senate 2nd Reading May 31, 2018. *Summary: This enactment removes the justification in the Criminal Code available to schoolteachers, parents and persons standing in the place of parents of using force as a means of correction toward a pupil or child under their care. It provides the Government with up to one year between the dates of royal assent and coming into force, which could be used to educate Canadians and to coordinate with the provinces.*
- An Act to amend the Criminal Code (sentencing for violent offences against Aboriginal women) (Bill S-215) Passed Senate December 15, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to require a court, when imposing a sentence for certain violent offences, to consider the fact that the victim is an Aboriginal woman to be an aggravating circumstance.*
- An Act to Amend the Criminal Code, the Youth Criminal Justice Act and other Acts and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill C-75) Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 25. Sections 278, 301, 314 come into force on the 30th day after the day on which this Act receives royal assent. Sections 1(1), (2), 2, 3, 4(1), 6 to 23, 25 to 29, 33 to 46, 48 to 50, 52, 55(2), 56 to 59, 61, 63, 64 to 69, 70 to 72, 74 to 76, 79 to 88, 90, 92 to 97, 103 to 110, 112 to 156, 157(1), 158 to 181, 183 to 186, 187(2), 188, 191 to 201, 203 to 208, 216, 225(2), 237 to 244, 245(1) to (3), 246, 247, 250, 251, 252, 253, 254(1), (4), (5), 255(1), (2), (4), (5), 256 to 259, 260(1), 261 to 263, 265, 267 to 275, 277, 281(1), (2), 282 to 286, 289 to 294, 298, 299, 302, 305 to 307, 315 to 319, 321, 322, 329 to 333, 334(1), (2), 336(1), 338 to 344, 345(1), 346, 347, 348(1), (2), 349(1), (2), 350 to 353, 370(1), 376 to 379, 382, 385, 399, 400.1 come into force on the 90th day after the day on which this Act receives royal assent. Sections 1(3), 5, 24, 30 to 32, 47, 91, 157(2), 182, 187(1), 209 to 215, 217 to 224, 225(1), (3) to (7), 226 to 236, 245(4), 248, 249, 254(2), (3), 255(3), 260(2), 264, 266, 276, 279, 280, 281(3), (4), 287, 288, 295, 296, 297, 300, 303, 304, 308 to 313, 323 to 328, 334(3), 335, 336(2), 337, 345(2), 348(3), 349(3), 361 to 369, 370(2), 371 to 375, 380, 381, 387 to 393, 396 to 398, 400 come into force on the 180th day after the day on which this Act receives royal assent. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code. The enactment also amends the Youth Criminal Justice Act in order to reduce delays within the youth criminal justice system and enhance the effectiveness of that system with respect to administration of justice offences. Finally, the enactment amends among other Acts An Act to amend the*

Criminal Code (exploitation and trafficking in persons) so that certain sections of that Act can come into force on different days and also makes consequential amendments to other Acts.

- An Act to amend the Criminal Code (unconstitutional provisions) and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill C-39) Commons 1st Reading March 8, 2017. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to, among other things, remove passages and repeal provisions that have been ruled unconstitutional by the Supreme Court of Canada. It also repeals section 159 of that Act and provides that no person shall be convicted of any historical offence of a sexual nature unless the act that constitutes the offence would constitute an offence under the Criminal Code if it were committed on the day on which the charge was laid. It also makes consequential amendments to the Corrections and Conditional Release Act and the Youth Criminal Justice Act.*
- An Act to amend the Criminal Code (victim surcharge) (Bill C-28) Commons 1st Reading October 21, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the victim surcharge provisions in the Criminal Code to (a) allow the court to exempt an offender from the payment of a victim surcharge in cases where the offender satisfies the court that the payment would cause the offender undue hardship and to provide the court with guidance with respect to what constitutes undue hardship; (b) provide that a victim surcharge is to be paid for each offence, with an exception for certain administration of justice offences if the total amount of surcharges imposed on an offender for these types of offences would be disproportionate in the circumstances; (c) require courts to provide reasons for the application of any exception for certain administration of justice offences or any exemption from the payment of a victim surcharge; and (d) clarify that these amendments apply to any offender who is sentenced after the day on which the amendments come into force, regardless of whether or not the offence was committed before that day.*
- An Act to amend the Customs Act (Bill C-21) Royal Assent December 13, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 30. Act comes into force on a day or days to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2019-44) The day on which this Order is made is fixed as the day on which the Act comes into force. *Summary: This enactment amends the Customs Act to authorize the Canada Border Services Agency to collect, from prescribed persons and prescribed sources, personal information on all persons who are leaving or have left Canada. It also amends the Act to authorize an officer, as defined in that Act, to require that goods that are to be exported from Canada are to be reported despite any exemption under that Act. In addition, it amends the Act to provide officers with the power to examine any goods that are to be exported. Finally, it amends the Act to authorize the disclosure of information collected under the Customs Act to an official of the Department of Employment and Social Development for the purposes of administering or enforcing the Old Age Security Act.*
- An Act to amend the Customs Tariff and the Canadian International Trade Tribunal Act (Bill C-101) Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 22. Sections

1(2) and 2(2) come into force on the second anniversary of the day on which this Act receives royal assent. *Summary: This enactment provides for the repeal of subsections 55(5) and (6) of the Customs Tariff and their subsequent re-enactment two years later. It also makes consequential amendments to the Canadian International Trade Tribunal Act.*

An Act to amend the Department of Public Works and Government Services Act (community benefit) (Bill C-227) Commons Reported with amendments December 5, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the Department of Public Works and Government Services Act to provide the Minister with the authority to require an assessment of the benefits that a community derives from a construction, maintenance or repair project.*

An Act to amend the Divorce Act, the Family Orders and Agreements Enforcement Assistance Act and the Garnishment, Attachment and Pension Diversion Act and to make consequential amendments to another Act (Bill C-78) Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 16. Sections 1(1) to (4), (6), (7), 2 to 6, 8 to 15, 16(2), 17 to 19, 21, 22, 23 to 25, 28(3), 32 to 35 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Sections 16(1), (3), 28(4), 30 and 36 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, but that day must not be before the day fixed in accordance with subsection (1). Section 1(5), 7, 20, 31, 37 to 41 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, but that day must not be before the day fixed in accordance with subsection (1). Section 22.1 comes into force in one or more provinces on a day or days to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Sections 43, 45, 46, 48, 49(1), (3), (5) to (7) come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Sections 51(1), (4), 52, 54, 66, 69(2), (6) come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Sections 73(2) to (6), 74, 76(3) come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Sections 105(1), 106(2), 111(2) to (4) and 115(3) and (5) come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2019-82) July 1, 2020 is fixed as the day on which ss. 1(1) to (4), (6), (7), 2 to 6, 8 to 15, 16(2), 17 to 19, 21, 22, 23 to 25, 28(3), 32 to 35 of the Act come into force. *Summary: This enactment amends the Divorce Act to, among other things, (a) replace terminology related to custody and access with terminology related to parenting; (b) establish a non-exhaustive list of criteria with respect to the best interests of the child; (c) create duties for parties and legal advisers to encourage the use of family dispute resolution processes; (d) introduce measures to assist the courts in addressing family violence; (e) establish a framework for the relocation of a child; and (f) simplify certain processes, including those related to family support obligations. The enactment also amends the Family Orders and Agreements Enforcement Assistance Act to, among other things, (a) allow the release of information to help obtain and vary a support provision; (b) expand the release of information to other provincial family justice government entities; (c) permit the garnishment of federal moneys to recover certain expenses related to family law; and (d) extend the binding period of a garnishee summons. The enactment also amends those two Acts to implement*

(a) the Convention on Jurisdiction, Applicable Law, Recognition, Enforcement and Co-operation in Respect of Parental Responsibility and Measures for the Protection of Children, concluded at The Hague on October 19, 1996; and (b) the Convention on the International Recovery of Child Support and Other Forms of Family Maintenance, concluded at The Hague on November 23, 2007. The enactment also amends the Garnishment, Attachment and Pension Diversion Act to, among other things, (a) give priority to family support obligations; and (b) simplify the processes under the Act. Finally, this enactment also includes transitional provisions and makes consequential amendments to the Criminal Code.

- An Act to amend the Export and Import Permits Act and the Criminal Code (amendments permitting the accession to the Arms Trade Treaty and other amendments) (Bill C-47). Royal Assent December 13, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 26. The Act, other than section 20, comes into force on a day or days to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2019-41) September 1, 2019 is fixed as the day on which the Act comes into force, other than section 20, which came into force on Royal Assent. *Summary: This enactment amends the Export and Import Permits Act. The enactment amends the Criminal Code to include, for interception of private communications purposes, the offence of brokering in the definition of “offence” in section 183.*
- An Act to amend the Federal Public Sector Labour Relations Act and other Acts (Bill C-62) Royal Assent November 26, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 24. *Summary: This enactment amends the Federal Public Sector Labour Relations Act to restore the procedures for the choice of process of dispute resolution including those involving essential services, arbitration, conciliation and alternative dispute resolution that existed before December 13, 2013. It also amends the Public Sector Equitable Compensation Act to restore the procedures applicable to arbitration and conciliation that existed before December 13, 2013. It repeals provisions of the Economic Action Plan 2013 Act, No. 2 that are not in force that amend the Federal Public Sector Labour Relations Act, the Canadian Human Rights Act, and the Public Service Employment Act and it repeals not in force provisions of the Economic Action Plan 2014 Act, No. 1 that amend those provisions. It repeals Division 20 of Part 3 of the Economic Action Plan 2015 Act, No. 1, which authorizes the Treasury Board to establish and modify, despite the Federal Public Sector Labour Relations Act, terms and conditions of employment related to the sick leave of employees who are employed in the core public administration.*
- An Act to amend the Federal Sustainable Development Act (Bill C-57). Royal Assent February 28, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 2. Act in force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2019-32) December 1, 2020 is fixed as the day on which that Act comes into force — (SOR/2019-177) the schedule to the Act is amended by adding the following after item 3: 4National Capital Commission, 5The Jacques-Cartier and Champlain Bridges Inc. *Summary: This enactment amends the Federal Sustainable Development Act to make decision making related to sustainable development more transparent and subject to accountability to Parliament.*

An Act to amend the Fisheries Act and other Acts in consequence (Bill C-68) Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 14. Sections 1(1), (5), (10), 8, 13, 19 to 24, 25(2), (4), (5), (6), (8), (10), (11), 27(1) to (6), (8), (9), 28 to 30, 31(6), (13), 52, 53, 55 to 57 and 58(2) come into force on a day or days to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2019-80) August 28, 2019 is fixed as the day on which ss. 1(1), (5), (10), 8, 13, 19 to 24, 25(2), (4) to (6), (8), (10), (11), 27(1) to (6), (8), (9), 28, 29, 31(6), (13), 52, 55 to 57, 58(2) of the Act come into force. *Summary: This enactment amends the Fisheries Act to, among other things, (a) require that, when making a decision under that Act, the Minister shall consider any adverse effects that the decision may have on the rights of the Indigenous peoples of Canada recognized and affirmed by section 35 of the Constitution Act, 1982, include provisions respecting the consideration and protection of traditional knowledge of the Indigenous peoples of Canada, and authorize the making of agreements with Indigenous governing bodies to further the purpose of the Fisheries Act; (b) add a purpose clause and considerations for decision-making under that Act; (c) empower the Minister to establish advisory panels and to set fees, including for the provision of regulatory processes; (d) provide measures for the protection of fish and fish habitat with respect to works, undertakings or activities that may result in the death of fish or the harmful alteration, disruption or destruction of fish habitat, including in ecologically significant areas, as well as measures relating to the modernization of the regulatory framework such as authorization of projects, establishment of standards and codes of practice, creation of fish habitat banks by a proponent of a project and establishment of a public registry; (e) empower the Governor in Council to make new regulations, including regulations respecting the rebuilding of fish stocks and importation of fish; (f) empower the Minister to make regulations for the purposes of the conservation and protection of marine biodiversity; (g) empower the Minister to make fisheries management orders prohibiting or limiting fishing for a period of 45 days to address a threat to the proper management and control of fisheries and the conservation and protection of fish; (h) prohibit the fishing of a cetacean with the intent to take it into captivity, unless authorized by the Minister, including when the cetacean is injured, in distress or in need of care; and (i) update and strengthen enforcement powers, as well as establish an alternative measures agreements regime. The enactment also makes consequential amendments to other Acts.*

An Act to amend the Food and Drugs Act, the Hazardous Products Act, the Radiation Emitting Devices Act, the Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999, the Pest Control Products Act and the Canada Consumer Product Safety Act and to make related amendments to another Act (Bill C-13) Royal Assent December 12, 2016: S.C. 2016, c. 9; in force on a day or days to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2017-33) order fixing the day on which this Order is made as the Day on which s. 12 of the Act Comes into Force. *Summary: This enactment enables Canada to implement the Agreement on Trade Facilitation, which was done at Geneva by members of the World Trade Organization, including Canada, on November 27, 2014, as*

an amendment to Annex 1A of the Marrakesh Agreement Establishing the World Trade Organization. It amends the Food and Drugs Act, the Hazardous Products Act, the Radiation Emitting Devices Act, the Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999, the Pest Control Products Act and the Canada Consumer Product Safety Act, to bring them into conformity with its obligations under the Agreement on Trade Facilitation.

- An Act to amend the Income Tax Act (Bill C-2) Royal Assent December 15, 2016: S.C. 2016, c. 11; in force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment amends the Income Tax Act to reduce the second personal income tax rate from 22% to 20.5% and to introduce a new personal marginal tax rate of 33% for taxable income in excess of \$200,000. It also amends other provisions of that Act to reflect the new 33% rate. In addition, it amends that Act to reduce the annual contribution limit for tax-free savings accounts from \$10,000 to its previous level with indexation (\$5,500 for 2016) starting January 1, 2016.*
- An Act to amend the Income Tax Act (credit tax first aid) (Bill C-240) Commons 2nd Reading October 25, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the Income Tax Act to provide a non-refundable tax credit to individuals who complete a first aid or other health and safety instructional program or course.*
- An Act to amend the Indian Act in response to the Superior Court of Quebec decision in *Descheneaux c. Canada (Procureur général)* (Bill S-3) Royal Assent December 12, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 25. Act, other than ss. 2.1, 3.1, 3.2 and 10.1, comes into force or is deemed to have come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, but that day must be the day on which the suspension of the declaration expires. Sections 2.1, 3.1, 3.2 and 10.1 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, but that day must be after the day fixed under subsection (1) — (SI/2018-2) December 22, 2017 fixed as the day on which the Act comes into force, other than ss. 2.1, 3.1, 3.2, 10.1 — (SI/2019-85) August 15, 2019 is fixed as the day on which ss. 2.1, 3.1, 3.2 and 10.1 of the Act come into force. *Summary: This enactment amends the Indian Act to provide new entitlements to registration in the Indian Register in response to the decision in *Descheneaux c. Canada (Procureur général)* that was rendered by the Superior Court of Quebec on August 3, 2015, and to provide that the persons who become so entitled also have the right to have their name entered in a Band List maintained by the Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development.*
- An Act to amend the Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act and the Canada Petroleum Resources Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill C-88). Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 19. Sections 1, 13, 15, 16, 18 to 29, 31 and 34 come into force on a day or days to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. *Summary: Part 1 of this enactment amends the Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act to establish an administration and enforcement scheme in Part 5 of that Act that includes the issuance of development certificates. It also adds an administrative monetary penalty scheme and a cost recovery scheme, provides regulation-making*

powers for both schemes and for consultation with Aboriginal peoples and it allows the Minister to establish a committee to conduct regional studies. Finally, it repeals a number of provisions of the Northwest Territories Devolution Act that, among other things, restructure the regional panels of the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board, but that were not brought into force. Part 2 of the enactment amends the Canada Petroleum Resources Act to allow the Governor in Council to prohibit certain works or activities on frontier lands if the Governor in Council considers that it is in the national interest to do so.

- An Act to amend the National Anthem Act (gender) (Bill C-210) Royal Assent February 7, 2018; S.C. 2018, c. 1. *Summary: This enactment amends the National Anthem Act to substitute the words ‘of us’ for the words ‘thy sons’ in the English version of the national anthem, thus making it gender neutral.*
- An Act to amend the National Defence Act and to make related and consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill C-77) Royal Assent June 21, 2019; S.C. 2019, c. 15. Subject to subsection (2), the provisions of this Act, other than ss. 63 to 67, come into force on a day or days to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Sections 2 and 29 of this Act come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. *Summary: This enactment amends provisions of the National Defence Act governing the military justice system. It adds a new Division, entitled “Declaration of Victims Rights”, to the Code of Service Discipline, that specifies that victims of service offences have a right to information, protection, participation and restitution in respect of service offences. It adds or amends several definitions, including “victim” and “military justice system participant”, and specifies who may act on a victim’s behalf for the purposes of that Division. Finally, the enactment makes related and consequential amendments to certain Acts. Most notably, it amends the Criminal Code to include military justice system participants in the class of persons against whom offences relating to intimidation of a justice system participant can be committed.*
- An Act to amend the Oceans Act and the Canada Petroleum Resources Act (Bill C-55) Royal Assent May 27, 2019; S.C. 2019, c. 8. Act in force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment amends the Oceans Act. This enactment also makes amendments to the Canada Petroleum Resources Act*
- An Act to amend the Official Languages Act (communications with and services to the public) (Bill S-209) Senate 2nd Reading November 17, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the Official Languages Act to introduce the concept of equal quality of communications and services offered by federal institutions in each official language. The enactment modifies the criteria used to determine if there is a significant demand for communications and services in either official language. The enactment specifies the locations where federal institutions have a duty to provide communications and services in both official languages. The enactment provides for a review of the regulations enacted under Part IV of the Act after every decennial census.*
- An Act to amend the Parliament of Canada Act (Parliamentary Artist Laureate) (Bill S-234) Passed Senate. Commons 1st Reading June 20, 2018. *Summary:*

This enactment creates the position of Parliamentary Artist Laureate. It also corrects a reference to the Canada Council for the Arts in the English version of the Parliament of Canada Act.

- An Act to amend the Pension Benefits Standards Act, 1985 (Bill C-27) Commons 1st Reading October 19, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the Pension Benefits Standards Act, 1985 to provide a framework for the establishment, administration and supervision of target benefit plans. It also amends the Act to permit pension plan administrators to purchase immediate or deferred life annuities for former members or survivors so as to satisfy an obligation to provide pension benefits if the obligation arises from a defined benefit provision.*
- An Act to amend the Public Service Labour Relations Act and other Acts (Bill C-34) Commons 1st Reading November 28, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the Public Service Labour Relations Act to restore the procedures for the choice of process of dispute resolution including those involving essential services, arbitration, conciliation and alternative dispute resolution that existed before December 13, 2013. It also amends the Public Sector Equitable Compensation Act to restore the procedures applicable to arbitration and conciliation that existed before December 13, 2013. It repeals provisions of the Economic Action Plan 2013 Act, No. 2 that are not in force that amend the Public Service Labour Relations Act, the Canadian Human Rights Act, and the Public Service Employment Act and it repeals not in force provisions of the Economic Action Plan 2014 Act, No. 1 that amend those provisions.*
- An Act to amend the Public Service Labour Relations Act, the Public Service Labour Relations and Employment Board Act and other Acts and to provide for certain other measures (Bill C-7) Royal Assent June 19, 2017; S.C. 2017, c. 9; in force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment amends the Public Service Labour Relations Act to provide for a labour relations regime for members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and reservists. It provides a process for an employee organization to acquire collective bargaining rights for members and reservists and includes provisions that regulate collective bargaining, arbitration, unfair labour practices and grievances. It also amends the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Act to bar grievances related to the interpretation and application of a collective agreement or arbitral award, which are to be filed in accordance with the Public Service Labour Relations Act. It changes the title of the Public Service Labour Relations Act and the Public Service Labour Relations and Employment Board Act and the name of the Public Service Labour Relations and Employment Board. It also amends that latter Act to increase the maximum number of full-time members of the Board and to require the Chairperson, when making recommendations for appointment, to take into account the need for two members with knowledge of police organizations. It also removes the exclusion of Royal Canadian Mounted Police members from the compensation scheme under the Government Employees Compensation Act.*
- An Act to amend the Rouge National Urban Park Act, the Parks Canada Agency Act and the Canada National Parks Act (Bill C-18) Royal Assent June 19,

2017; S.C. 2017, c. 10; in force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment amends the Rouge National Urban Park Act to set out priorities in respect of factors to be considered in the management of the park. Additionally, it adds land to the park. It also amends the Parks Canada Agency Act to allow the New Parks and Historic Sites Account to be used in a broader manner. Finally, it amends the Canada National Parks Act to modify the boundary of Wood Buffalo National Park of Canada.*

An Act to amend the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Act and the Canada Border Services Agency Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill C-98) Passed Commons. Senate 1st Reading June 20, 2019. *Summary: This enactment amends the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Act to, among other things, rename the Civilian Review and Complaints Commission for the Royal Canadian Mounted Police as the Public Complaints and Review Commission. It also amends the Canada Border Services Agency Act to, among other things, grant to that Commission powers, duties and functions in relation to the Canada Border Services Agency, including the power to conduct a review of the activities of that Agency and to investigate complaints concerning the conduct of any of that Agency's officers or employees. It also makes consequential amendments to other Acts.*

An Act to amend the Salaries Act and to make a consequential amendment to the Financial Administration Act (Bill C-24). Royal Assent June 21, 2018; S.C. 2018, c. 18; in force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment amends the Salaries Act to authorize payment, out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, of the salaries for eight new ministerial positions. It authorizes the Governor in Council to designate departments to support the ministers who occupy those positions and authorizes those ministers to delegate their powers, duties or functions to officers or employees of the designated departments. It also makes a consequential amendment to the Financial Administration Act.*

An Act to amend the Statistics Act (Bill C-36). Royal Assent December 12, 2017; S.C. 2017, c. 31. In force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment amends the Statistics Act to strengthen the independence of Statistics Canada, including by providing for the appointment of the Chief Statistician to hold office during good behaviour and by assigning to the Chief Statistician the powers related to methods, procedures and operations of Statistics Canada. It also establishes a transparent process to issue directives to the Chief Statistician concerning those methods, procedures and operations or the statistical programs. In addition, it establishes the Canadian Statistics Advisory Council, no longer requires the consent of respondents to transfer their Census information to Library and Archives Canada and repeals imprisonment as a penalty for any offence committed by a respondent. Finally, it amends certain provisions by modernizing the language of the Act to better reflect current methods of collecting statistical information.*

An Act to amend the Tobacco Act and the Non- Health Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill S-5) Royal Assent May 23, 2018; S.C. 2018, c. 9. In force as set out in the Act — (SI/2019-21) the day that is 200 days after the day on which this Order is made is fixed as the day on

which ss. 7(2), 8, 11(2), 25, 28, 31 and 57 of the Act come into force. *Summary: Part 1 of this enactment amends the Tobacco Act. In order to respond to the report of the House of Standing Committee on Health entitled Vaping: Toward a Regulatory Framework for E-Cigarettes, it amends the Act to regulate the manufacture, sale, labelling and promotion of vaping products and changes the title of the Act accordingly. It also amends certain provisions of the Act relating to tobacco products, including with respect to product standards, disclosure of product information, product sale, sending and delivery and product promotion. As well, it adds new provisions to the Act, including in respect of inspection and seizure.*

An Act to amend the Yukon Environmental and Socio-economic Assessment Act and to make a consequential amendment to another Act (Bill C-17) Royal Assent December 14, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 34. *Summary: This enactment amends the Yukon Environmental and Socio-economic Assessment Act. The enactment also amends the Yukon and Nunavut Regulatory Improvement Act by repealing the transitional provision relating to the application of time limit provisions enacted by that Act to projects in respect of which the evaluation, screening or review had begun before that Act came into force but for which no decision had yet been made.*

An Act to enact the Impact Assessment Act and the Canadian Energy Regulator Act, to amend the Navigation Protection Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill C-69) Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 28. The Act, other than sections 2 to 8, 47(4), 55, 60, 61(5), 62, 74, 189 to 195, come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Sections 2(1), (3), 3(1), 4(1), 5(1), 6, 8(1), (3) come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council that is not earlier than one day after the day referred to in subsection (1). Sections 2(2), (4), 3(2), 4(2), 5(2), 7, 8(2), (4) come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council that is not earlier than one day after the day referred to in subsection (1). Sections 60, 61(5) come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council that is not earlier than one day after the day referred to in subsection (1) — (SI/2019-86) August 28, 2019 is fixed as the day on which that Act, other than ss. 2 to 8, 47(4), 55, 60, 61(5), 62, 74 and 189 to 195, comes into force — (SI/2019-87) August 29, 2019 is fixed as the day on which ss. 60 and 61(5) of the Act come into force. *Summary: Part 1 enacts the Impact Assessment Act and repeals the Canadian Environmental Assessment Act, 2012. Part 2 enacts the Canadian Energy Regulator Act, which establishes the Canadian Energy Regulator and sets out its composition, mandate and powers. The role of the Regulator is to regulate the exploitation, development and transportation of energy within Parliament's jurisdiction. Part 2 also repeals the National Energy Board Act. Part 3 amends the Navigation Protection Act. Part 4 makes consequential amendments to Acts of Parliament and regulations.*

An Act to establish the National Security and Intelligence Committee of Parliamentarians and to make consequential amendments to certain Acts (Bill C-22) Royal Assent June 22, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 15; Act in force on a day to be

fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2017-63) fixes the day on which this Order is made as the day on which the Act comes into force. *Summary: This enactment establishes the National Security and Intelligence Committee of Parliamentarians and sets out its composition and mandate. In addition, it establishes the s Secretariat, the role of which is to assist the Committee in fulfilling its mandate. It also makes consequential amendments to certain Acts.*

- An Act to implement the Agreement between Canada, the United States of America and the United Mexican States (C-100) Commons 2nd Reading June 20, 2019. *Summary: This enactment implements the Agreement between Canada, the United States of America and the United Mexican States, done at Buenos Aires on November 30, 2018. The general provisions of the enactment set out rules of interpretation and specify that no recourse is to be taken on the basis of ss. 9 to 19 or any order made under those sections, or on the basis of the provisions of the Agreement, without the consent of the Attorney General of Canada. Part 1 approves the Agreement, provides for the payment by Canada of its share of the expenditures associated with the operation of the institutional and administrative aspects of the Agreement and gives the Governor in Council the power to make orders in accordance with the Agreement. Part 2 amends certain Acts to bring them into conformity with Canada's obligations under the Agreement. Part 3 contains coordinating amendments and the coming into force provisions.*
- An Act to provide no-cost, expedited record suspensions for simple possession of cannabis (Bill C-93). Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 20. Act comes into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2019-78) August 1, 2019 is fixed as the day on which the Act comes into force. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Records Act to, among other things, allow persons who have been convicted under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act, the Narcotic Control Act and the National Defence Act only of simple possession of cannabis offences committed before October 17, 2018 to apply for a record suspension without being subject to the period required by the Criminal Records Act for other offences or to the fee that is otherwise payable in applying for a suspension.*
- An Act related to the repeal of section 159 of the Criminal Code (Bill C-32) Commons 1st Reading November 15, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to repeal section 159 and to provide that no person shall be convicted of any historical offence of a sexual nature unless the act that constitutes the offence would constitute an offence under the Criminal Code if it were committed on the day on which the charge was laid. It also makes consequential amendments to that Act, the Corrections and Conditional Release Act and the Youth Criminal Justice Act.*
- An Act to repeal Division 20 of Part 3 of the Economic Action Plan 2015 Act, No. 1 (Bill C-5) Commons 1st Reading February 5, 2016. *Summary: This enactment repeals Division 20 of Part 3 of the Economic Action Plan 2015 Act, No. 1, which authorizes the Treasury Board to establish and modify, despite the Public Service Labour Relations Act, terms and conditions of em-*

ployment related to the sick leave of employees who are employed in the core public administration.

- An Act respecting a payment to be made out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to support a pan-Canadian artificial intelligence strategy (Bill C-43) Commons 1st Reading March 24, 2017. *Summary: This enactment authorizes a payment to be made out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Canadian Institute for Advanced Research to support a pan-Canadian artificial intelligence strategy.*
- Anishinabek Nation Education Agreement Act (Bill C-61) Royal Assent December 14, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 32. Act, other than section 19, comes into force on April 1, 2018. *Summary: This enactment gives effect to the Anishinabek Nation Education Agreement and makes consequential amendments to other Acts.*
- Appropriation Act No. 1, 2016-17 (Bill C-9) Royal Assent March 24, 2016: S.C. 2016, c. 2; in force on Assent.
- Appropriation Act No. 1, 2017-18 (Bill C-41) Royal Assent March 30, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 2. *Summary: This enactment grants the sum of \$30,140,965,114.44 towards defraying charges and expenses of the federal public administration for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2018 that are not otherwise provided for.*

- Canada Prompt Payment Act (Bill S-224) Passed Senate May 4, 2017. *Summary: This enactment enacts the Canada Prompt Payment Act to provide for timely payment to contractors under construction contracts with government institutions, and to subcontractors under related subcontracts.*
- Canada-European Union Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement Implementation Act (Bill C-30) Royal Assent May 16, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 6. The provisions of this Act, other than ss. 133 to 137, come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, s. 8(3), paragraph 11(1)(a), s. 11(2), paragraph 13(a) and s. 90 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, but that day must not be before the day referred to in subsection (1), ss. 32(1) and (4) come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, ss. 32(2) and 34(1) and (2) and ss. 36 and 38 to 42 come into force on a day or days to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, but that day or those days must be on or before the day referred to in subsection (1), ss. 45 to 58 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, but that day must not be before the day referred to in subsection (1). *Summary: This enactment implements the Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement between Canada and the European Union and its Member States, done at Brussels on October 30, 2016. - Canada-Madagascar Tax Convention Implementation Act, 2018 (Bill S-6) Royal Assent May 27, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 7. The Act is in force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment implements the Convention between Canada and the Republic of Madagascar for the avoidance of double taxation and the prevention of fiscal evasion with respect to taxes on income and a related protocol. The convention is generally patterned on the Model Tax Convention on Income and on Capital developed by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD). The convention has two main objectives: the avoidance of double taxation and the prevention of fiscal evasion. Once implemented, it will provide relief from taxation rules set out in, or related to, the Income Tax Act. That implementation requires the enactment of this Act.*
- Canada-Ukraine Free Trade Agreement Implementation Act (Bill C-31) Royal Assent June 1, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 8. The Act, other than s. 43, comes into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2017-37) August 1, 2017 fixed as the day on which the Act comes into force. *Summary: This enactment implements the Free Trade Agreement between Canada and Ukraine, done at Kyiv on July 11, 2016. The general provisions of the enactment set out rules of interpretation and specify that no recourse may be taken on the basis of sections 9 to 15 or any order made under those*

sections, or on the basis of the provisions of the Agreement, without the consent of the Attorney General of Canada.

Canadian Jewish Heritage Month Act (S-232) Royal Assent March 29, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 5. *Summary: This enactment designates the month of May in each and every year as “Canadian Jewish Heritage Month”.*

Cannabis Act (Bill C-45) Royal Assent June 21, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 16; Subject to subsection (2), the provisions of the Act, except sections 160.1,161,188 to 193,194,199 to 202,206 and 225, come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, if section 193.1 does not come into force by order before the first anniversary of the day on which section 33 comes into force, section 193.1 comes into force on the first anniversary of the day on which section 33 comes into force — (SI/2018-52) October 17, 2018 fixed as the day on which the Act, other than ss. 160.1, 161, 188 to 193, 193.1, 194, 199 to 202, 206 and 225, comes into force — (SOR/2019-207) Items 5 and 6 of Schedule 3 to the Act are deleted; Schedule 3 to the Act is amended by adding the following after item 4: 5 cannabis concentrates 0.25 g; Item 2 of Schedule 4 to the Act is deleted; Items 6 and 7 of Schedule 4 to the Act are deleted; Schedule 4 to the Act is amended by adding the following after item 5: 6 edible cannabis, 7 cannabis extracts, 8 cannabis topicals; Order ino force on the day on which s. 2 of the Regulations Amending the Cannabis Regulations (New Classes of Cannabis) comes into force, but if it is registered after that day, this Order comes into force on the day on which it is registered, section 3 comes into force on the first anniversary of the day on which section 1 comes into force. *Summary: This enactment enacts the Cannabis Act to provide legal access to cannabis and to control and regulate its production, distribution and sale. The objectives of the Act are to prevent young persons from accessing cannabis, to protect public health and public safety by establishing strict product safety and product quality requirements and to deter criminal activity by imposing serious criminal penalties for those operating outside the legal framework. The Act is also intended to reduce the burden on the criminal justice system in relation to cannabis. This enactment also amends the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act to, among other things, increase the maximum penalties for certain offences and to authorize the Minister to engage persons having technical or specialized knowledge to provide advice. It repeals item 1 of Schedule II and makes consequential amendments to that Act as the result of that repeal. In addition, it repeals Part XII.1 of the Criminal Code, which deals with instruments and literature for illicit drug use, and makes consequential amendments to that Act. It amends the Non-smokers’ Health Act to prohibit the smoking and vaping of*

cannabis in federally regulated places and conveyances. Finally, it makes consequential amendments to other Acts.

- Child Health Protection Act (Bill S-228) Passed Senate. Passed Commons September 19, 2018. *Summary: This enactment amends the Food and Drugs Act to prohibit food and beverage marketing directed at persons under 13 years of age.*
- College of Patent Agents and Trade-mark Agents Act (enactment)...See...Budget Implementation Act, 2018, No. 2 (Bill C-86) S.C. 2018, c. 27.
- Communications Security Establishment Act (enactment)...See...National Security Act, 2017 (Bill C-59) S.C. 2019, c. 13.
- Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership Implementation Act (Bill C-79) Royal Assent October 25, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 23; The Act, other than section 49, comes into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. *Summary: this enactment implements the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership, done at Santiago on March 8, 2018. The general provisions of the enactment set out rules of interpretation and specify that no recourse is to be taken on the basis of sections 9 to 13 or any order made under those sections, or on the basis of the provisions of the Agreement, without the consent of the Attorney General of Canada. Part 1 approves the Agreement, provides for the payment by Canada of its share of the expenditures associated with the operation of the institutional and administrative aspects of the Agreement and gives the Governor in Council the power to make orders in accordance with the Agreement. Part 2 amends certain Acts to bring them into conformity with Canada's obligations under the Agreement. Part 3 contains coordinating amendments and the coming into force provision.*
- Conveyance Presentation and Reporting Requirements Modernization Act (Bill S-233) Royal Assent June 19, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 11; in force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment amends the Customs Act to exempt certain persons from the requirement to present themselves to a customs officer if (a) they enter Canadian waters, including the inland waters, or the airspace over Canada on board a conveyance directly from another country and return to that other country without stopping while in Canadian waters, including inland waters, or in the airspace over Canada; or (b) they leave Canadian waters, including the inland waters, on board a conveyance and then re-enter Canadian waters, including the inland waters, without stopping while in the waters of the other country or the airspace over that other country, unless the officer requires them to comply with ss. 11(1) and (3) of that Act. It also exempts the goods imported on board such a conveyance from the requirement to be reported at a customs office unless an officer otherwise requires. Further, it adds a regulation-making authority for defining the expression "make contact with a conveyance". Finally, this enactment amends the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act by adding a regulation-making authority exempting certain persons or categories of persons from the requirement to*

appear for an examination to determine their right to enter or remain in Canada.

Cree Nation of Eeyou Istchee Governance Agreement Act (Bill C-70) Royal Assent March 29, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 4. *Summary: This enactment gives effect to the Agreement on Cree Nation Governance between the Crees of Eeyou Istchee and the Government of Canada. It amends the Cree-Naskapi (of Quebec) Act to reduce the administrative burden related to the internal governance of the Naskapi, to ensure that the Act no longer applies to the Crees of Eeyou Istchee and to make changes to certain aspects of the mandate of the Cree-Naskapi Commission to take into account the Agreement. It also makes related and consequential amendments to other Acts.*

Cruelty-Free Cosmetics Act (Bill S-214) Passed Senate June 19, 2018. *Summary: This enactment amends the Food and Drugs Act to prohibit cosmetic animal testing and the sale of cosmetics developed or manufactured using cosmetic animal testing. It also provides that no evidence derived from animal testing may be used to establish the safety of a cosmetic.*

Drug-Impaired Driving Detection Act (Bill S-230) Passed Senate December 15, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to authorize the use of an approved screening device to detect the presence of drugs in the body of a person who was operating a vehicle or who had the care or control of a vehicle. It also authorizes the taking of samples of bodily substances to determine the concentration of drugs in a person's body, based on physical coordination tests and the result of the analysis conducted using an approved screening device.*

Elections Modernization Act (Bill C-76) Royal Assent December 13, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 31. In force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment amends the Canada Elections Act to establish spending limits for third parties and political parties during a defined period before the election period of a general election held on a day fixed under that Act. It also establishes measures to increase transparency regarding the participation of third parties in the electoral process. The enactment also amends the Act to implement measures to reduce barriers to participation and increase accessibility. The enactment also amends the Act to modernize voting services, facilitate enforcement and improve various aspects of the administration of elections and of political financing. The enactment also amends the Act to provide for certain requirements with regard to the protection of personal information for registered parties, eligible parties and political parties that are applying to become registered parties, including the obligation for the party to adopt a policy for the protection of personal information and to publish it on its Internet site. The enactment also amends the Parliament of Canada Act to prevent the calling of a by-election when a vacancy in the House of Commons occurs within nine months before the day fixed for a general election under the Canada Elections Act. It also amends the Public Service Employment Act to clarify that the maximum period of employment of casual workers in the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer - 165 working days in one calendar year - applies to those who are appointed by the Commissioner of Canada Elections. Finally,*

the enactment contains transitional provisions, makes consequential amendments to other Acts and repeals the Special Voting Rules.

- Eliminating Foreign Funding in Elections Act (Bill S-239). Senate 2nd Reading June 5, 2018. *Summary: This enactment amends the Canada Elections Act to broaden the prohibition on inducements of electors by non-residents and to clarify the meaning of “induce”. It also makes it an offence for a third party to accept a foreign contribution for any purposes related to an election and expands the list of foreign contributors in section 358.*
- Ending the Captivity of Whales and Dolphins Act (Bill S-203). Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, 11. In force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to create offences respecting cetaceans in captivity. It also amends the Fisheries Act to prohibit the taking of a cetacean into captivity and the Wild Animal and Plant Protection and Regulation of International and Interprovincial Trade Act to prohibit the import of a cetacean into Canada and the export of a cetacean from Canada.*
- Expungement of Historically Unjust Convictions Act (Bill C-66). Royal Assent June 21, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 11; in force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment creates a procedure for expunging certain historically unjust convictions and provides for the destruction or removal of the judicial records of those convictions from federal repositories and systems. It gives the Parole Board of Canada jurisdiction to order or refuse to order expungement of a conviction. The enactment deems a person who is convicted of an offence for which expungement is ordered never to have been convicted of that offence. The enactment provides that an application for an expungement order may be made in respect of convictions involving consensual sexual activity between same-sex persons related to the offences of gross indecency, buggery and anal intercourse. The enactment provides that the Governor in Council may add certain offences to the schedule and establish criteria that must be satisfied for expungement of a conviction to be ordered. The enactment also makes related amendments to other Acts.*
- Fairness for All Canadian Taxpayers Act (measuring the tax gap to fight international tax evasion) (Bill S-243) Passed Senate. Commons 1st Reading December 13, 2018. *Summary: This enactment amends the Canada Revenue Agency Act to require the Canada Revenue Agency to report on all convictions for tax evasion, including international tax evasion, and on the tax gap in the annual report it submits to the Minister of National Revenue for tabling in Parliament. It also requires the Minister to provide data on the tax gap to the Parliamentary Budget Officer.*
- Federal Framework on Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder Act (Bill C-211) Royal Assent June 21, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 13; in force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment requires the Minister of Health to convene a conference with the Minister of National Defence, the Minister of Veterans Affairs, provincial and territorial government representatives responsible for health and representatives of the medical community and patients’ groups for the purpose of developing a comprehensive federal framework to address the*

challenges of recognizing the symptoms and providing timely diagnosis and treatment of post-traumatic stress disorder.

- Federal Prompt Payment for Construction Work Act (enactment)...See....Budget Implementation Act, 2019, No. 1 (Bill C-97) S.C. 2019, c. 29.
- Framework on Palliative Care in Canada Act (Bill C-277) Royal Assent December 12, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 28. *Summary: This enactment provides for the development and implementation of a framework designed to guarantee all Canadians access to high-quality palliative care.*
- Genetic Non-Discrimination Act (Bill S-201) Royal Assent May 4, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 3. *Summary: This enactment prohibits any person from requiring an individual to undergo a genetic test or disclose the results of a genetic test as a condition of providing goods or services to, entering into or continuing a contract or agreement with, or offering specific conditions in a contract or agreement with, the individual. Exceptions are provided for health care practitioners and researchers. The enactment provides individuals with other protections related to genetic testing and test results. The enactment amends the Canada Labour Code to protect employees from being required to undergo or to disclose the results of a genetic test, and provides employees with other protections related to genetic testing and test results. It also amends the Canadian Human Rights Act to prohibit discrimination on the ground of genetic characteristics. The Privacy Act and the Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act are also amended to expressly include information derived from genetic testing personal.*
- Greenhouse Gas Pollution Pricing Act (enactment)...See....Budget Implementation Act, 2018, No. 1 (Bill C-74) — (SOR/2018-212) Part 2 of Schedule 1 to the Act is amended by adding the following after the heading ‘Provinces and Areas for the Purposes of Part 2 of the Act’: 1. Ontario, 2. New Brunswick, 3. Manitoba, 4. Prince Edward Island, 5. Saskatchewan, 6. Yukon, 7. Nunavut; Order in force on the day on which it is registered — (SOR/2019-79) Part 1 of Schedule 1 to the Act is amended, Table 1 of Part 1 of Schedule 1 to the Act is amended, Tables 1 to 5 of Schedule 2 to the Act are replaced, Tables 1 to 4 of Schedule 2 to the Act are replaced; Sections 1 and 3 come into force on April 1, 2019, Sections 2 and 4 come into force on July 1, 2019.
- Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act (Bill C-224) Royal Assent May 4, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 4. *Summary: This enactment amends the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act in order to exempt from charges for possession a person who seeks emergency medical or law enforcement assistance for themselves or another person following overdosing on a controlled substance.*
- Impact Assessment Act (enactment)...See....An Act to enact the Impact Assessment Act and the Canadian Energy Regulator Act, to amend the Navigation Protection Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Bill C-69) S.C. 2019, c. 28.
- Impaired Driving Act (Bill C-226) Commons 2nd Reading June 9, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the provisions of the Criminal Code that govern offences in relation to conveyances. The enactment also amends the Criminal Records Act to remove the offences of impaired driving and failure*

or refusal to comply with a demand as exceptions to the offences that result in a record suspension ceasing to have effect. Finally, the enactment makes consequential amendments to those Acts and to other Acts.

Indigenous Languages Act (Bill C-91). Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 23. The Act come into force on a day or days to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2019-93) The day after the day on which this Order is made as the day on which ss. 1 to 11, 13, 13.1, 16, 18 and 19 of the Act come into force; and the earlier of October 1, 2020 and the day on which a Commissioner is appointed under s. 13 of the Act as the day on which ss. 12, 14, 15, 17 and 20 to 49.1 of the Act come into force. *Summary: This enactment provides, among other things, that (a) the Government of Canada recognizes that the rights of Indigenous peoples recognized and affirmed by section 35 of the Constitution Act, 1982 include rights related to Indigenous languages; (b) the Minister of Canadian Heritage may enter into different types of agreements or arrangements in respect of Indigenous languages with Indigenous governments or other Indigenous governing bodies or Indigenous organizations, taking into account the unique circumstances and needs of Indigenous groups, communities and peoples; and (c) federal institutions may cause documents to be translated into an Indigenous language or provide interpretation services to facilitate the use of an Indigenous language. The enactment also establishes the Office of the Commissioner of Indigenous Languages and sets out its composition. The Office's mandate and powers, duties and functions include (a) supporting the efforts of Indigenous peoples to reclaim, revitalize, maintain and strengthen Indigenous languages; (b) promoting public awareness of, among other things, the richness and diversity of Indigenous languages; (c) undertaking research or studies in respect of the provision of funding for the purposes of supporting Indigenous languages and in respect of the use of Indigenous languages in Canada; (d) providing services, including mediation or other culturally appropriate services, to facilitate the resolution of disputes; and (e) submitting to the Minister of Canadian Heritage an annual report on, among other things, the use and vitality of Indigenous languages in Canada and the adequacy of funding provided by the Government of Canada for initiatives related to Indigenous languages.*

Intelligence Commissioner Act (enactment)...See...National Security Act, 2017 (Bill C-59) S.C. 2019, c. 13.

International Mother Language Day Act (Bill S-247) Senate 2nd Reading December 5, 2018. *Summary: This enactment designates the 21st day of February in each and every year as 'International Mother Language Day'.*

Journalistic Sources Protection Act (Bill S-231) Royal Assent October 18, 2017; S.C. 2017, c. 22. In force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment amends the Canada Evidence Act to protect the confidentiality of journalistic sources. It allows journalists to not disclose information or a document that identifies or is likely to identify a journalistic source unless the information or document cannot be obtained by any other reasonable means and the pub-*

lic interest in the administration of justice outweighs the public interest in preserving the confidentiality of the journalistic source. The enactment also amends the Criminal Code so that only a judge of a superior court of criminal jurisdiction or a judge within the meaning of section 552 of that Act may issue a search warrant relating to a journalist. It also provides that a search warrant can be issued only if the judge is satisfied that there is no other way by which the desired information can reasonably be obtained and that the public interest in the investigation and prosecution of a criminal offence outweighs the journalist's right to privacy in the collection and dissemination of information. The judge must also be satisfied that these same conditions apply before an officer can examine, reproduce or make copies of a document obtained under a search warrant relating to a journalist.

Justice for Victims of Corrupt Foreign Officials Act (Sergei Magnitsky Law) (Bill S-226) Royal Assent October 18, 2017; S.C. 2017, c. 21. In force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment enacts the Justice for Victims of Corrupt Foreign Officials Act (Sergei Magnitsky Law) to provide for the taking of restrictive measures in respect of foreign nationals responsible for gross violations of internationally recognized human rights. It also proposes related amendments to the Special Economic Measures Act and to the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act.*

Kindness Week Act (Bill S-244) Passed Senate December 11, 2018. *Summary: This enactment designates the third week of February in each and every year as 'Kindness Week'.*

Latin American Heritage Month Act (Bill S-218) Royal Assent June 21, 2018; S.C. 2018, c. 19; in force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment designates the month of October in each and every year as 'Latin American Heritage Month'.*

Miscellaneous Statute Law Amendment Act, 2017 (Bill C-60) Royal Assent December 12, 2017; S.C. 2017, c. 26. In force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment is the 12th in a series of bills introduced under the Miscellaneous Statute Law Amendment (MSLA) Program. It amends 41 Acts to correct grammatical, spelling, terminological, typographical and cross-referencing errors, update archaic wording and correct discrepancies between the two language versions. It also updates the names of certain organizations, for example, "Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants" is replaced with "Chartered Professional Accountants of Canada". Finally, it contains amendments repealing eight Acts that no longer have any application, for example, the Maintenance of Ports Operations Act, 1986. This enactment has been drafted based on the Thirteenth Report of the Standing Committee on Justice and Human Rights tabled in the House of Commons on May 31, 2017 and the Twenty-first Report of the Standing Senate Committee on Legal and Constitutional Affairs tabled in the Senate on June 21, 2017.*

Multilateral Instrument in Respect of Tax Conventions Act (Bill C-82) Royal Assent June 21, 2019; S.C. 2019, c. 12. In force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment implements a multilateral instrument in respect of conventions for the avoidance of double taxation and the prevention of fiscal*

evasion with respect to taxes on income. The multilateral instrument is an international treaty developed as part of the G20 and OECD's project to tackle base erosion and profit shifting (BEPS). The purpose of the multilateral instrument is to modify, in their application, tax conventions between two or more parties to the multilateral instrument so as to further the objectives of the tax convention. The multilateral instrument operates alongside tax conventions to modify them in their application; it does not directly modify the text of the tax conventions. The multilateral instrument will apply to a Canadian bilateral double tax convention only if both parties to the convention notify the depositary that the convention is intended to be covered by the multilateral instrument. The Secretary-General of the OECD is the depositary of the multilateral instrument. The implementation of the multilateral instrument requires the enactment of this Act.

National Housing Strategy Act (enactment)....See....Budget Implementation Act, 2019, No. 1 (Bill C-97) S.C. 2019, c. 29.

National Local Food Day Act (Bill C-281) Passed Commons. Senate reported with amendments May 29, 2019. *Summary: This enactment designates the Friday before Thanksgiving Day in each and every year as "National Local Food Day".*

National Maternity Assistance Program Strategy Act (Bill C-243) Passed Commons. Senate reported without amendments December 7, 2018. *Summary: The purpose of this enactment is to provide for the development and implementation of a national maternity assistance program strategy and to amend the Employment Insurance Act in order to allow a claimant to begin using her maternity benefits 15 weeks before the week in which her confinement is expected if she is unable to perform the duties of her regular or usual employment or of other suitable employment because her current job functions may pose a risk to her health or to that of her unborn child and her employer is unable to modify her job functions or reassign her to another job.*

National Physicians' Day (Bill S-248) Passed Senate. Commons reported without amendments June 5, 2019. *Summary: This enactment designates May 1 as 'National Physicians' Day'.*

National Seal Products Day Act (Bill S-208) Royal Assent May 16, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 5. *Summary: This enactment designates May 20 National Seal Products.*

National Security Act, 2017 (Bill C-59) Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 13. Parts 1 and 2, other than ss. 48, 49, 74 and 75, come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Part 3, other than ss. 83, 90 and 91, come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, but that day must be later than the day fixed under s. 169. Sections 94, 96, 97, 102, 107 and 108 and the provisions enacted by them and ss. 110 and 111 come into force on a day or days to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Section 101 comes into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council, but that day must not be earlier than the day fixed under s. 169. Subsections 119(2) and 120(2) come into force on the day fixed under s. 169. Sections 127, 130, 132, 133 and 136, ss. 137(1), (3) and (6) and

s. 138 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Sections 128, 129(1), 131, 134, 135, 137(2), (4), (5) and (7), 139 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Subsection 129(2) is deemed to have come into force on August 1, 2015 — (SI/2019-67) The day on which this Order is made is fixed as the day on which Parts 1 and 2 of the Act come into force, other than ss. 48, 49, 74 and 75 — (SI/2019-70) August 1, 2019 is fixed as the day on which Part 3 of the Act comes into force, other than ss. 83, 90 and 91, which came into force on assent — (SI/2019-71) The day after the day on which this Order is made is fixed as the day on which Part 1.1, other than section 49.2, of the Act comes into force; the day after the day on which this Order is made is fixed as the day on which ss. 94, 96, 97, 102, 107 and 108, and the provisions enacted by them, and ss. 110 and 111 of the Act come into force; the later of the day after the day on which this Order is made and the day after the day fixed under s. 169 of that Act is fixed as the day on which s. 101 of the Act comes into force; and the day after the day on which this Order is made is fixed as the day on which ss. 128, 129(1), 131, 134, 135, 137(2), (4), (5) and (7), 139 of the Act come into force. *Summary: Part 1 enacts the National Security and Intelligence Review Agency Act, which establishes the National Security and Intelligence Review Agency and sets out its composition, mandate and powers. It repeals the provisions of the Canadian Security Intelligence Service Act establishing the Security Intelligence Review Committee and amends that Act and other Acts in order to transfer certain powers, duties and functions to the new Agency. It also makes related and consequential amendments to other Acts. Part 2 enacts the Intelligence Commissioner Act, which provides that the duties and functions of the Intelligence Commissioner are to review the conclusions on the basis of which certain authorizations are issued or amended, and determinations are made, under the Communications Security Establishment Act and the Canadian Security Intelligence Service Act and to approve those authorizations, admendments and determinations if those conclusions are reasonable. This Part also abolishes the position of the Commissioner of the Communications Security Establishment, provides for that Commissioner to become the Intelligence Commissioner, transfers the employees of the former Commissioner to the office of the new Commissioner and makes related and consequential amendments to other Acts. Part 3 enacts the Communications Security Establishment Act, which establishes the Communications Security Establishment and, among other things, sets out the s mandate as well as the regime for authorizing its activities. It also amends the National Defence Act and makes consequential amendments to other Acts. Part 4 amends the Canadian Security Intelligence Service Act. Part 5 amends the Security of Canada Information Sharing Act. Part 6 amends the Secure Air Travel Act. Part 7 amends the Criminal Code. Part 8 amends the Youth Criminal Justice Act. Part 9 requires that a comprehensive review of the provisions and operation of this enactment take place during the sixth year after section 168 of this enactment comes into force. If that s. 168 and s. 34 of Bill C-22, introduced in the 1st session of the 42nd Parlia-*

ment and entitled the National Security and Intelligence Committee of Parliamentarians Act, come into force within one year of each other, the reviews required by those sections are to take place at the same time and are to be undertaken by the same committee or committees.

National Security and Intelligence Review Agency Act (enactment)...See...National Security Act, 2017 (Bill C-59) Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 13.

National Sickle Cell Awareness Day Act (Bill S-211) Royal Assent December 12, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 24. *Summary: This enactment designates the nineteenth day of June in each and every year as 'National Sickle Cell Awareness Day'.*

National Strategy for Alzheimer's Disease and Other Dementias Act (Bill C-233) Royal Assent June 22, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 19; in force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment provides for the development and implementation of a national strategy for the health care of persons afflicted with s disease and other forms of dementia.*

National Strategy for Safe Disposal of Lamps Containing Mercury Act (Bill C-238) Royal Assent June 22, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 16; in force as set out in the Act. *Summary: This enactment provides for the development and implementation of a national strategy to promote the safe disposal of lamps containing mercury.*

National Strategy for the Prevention of Domestic Violence Act (S-249) Senate 2nd Reading November 29, 2018. *Summary: The purpose of this enactment is to provide for the development of a national strategy for the prevention of domestic violence, following consultations between federal ministers and representatives of the provincial and territorial governments responsible for social development, families or public safety, as well as other relevant stakeholders.*

Non-Nuclear Sanctions Against Iran Act (Bill S-219) Senate reported without amendment April 4, 2017. *Summary: This enactment provides for an ongoing analysis of the incidence of terrorist activity, support of terrorism, incitement to hatred, and human rights violations, emanating from Iran, the identification of Iranian officials who are responsible for such activities and the strengthening of Canada's non-nuclear sanctions regime against Iran. The enactment also provides for the freezing of assets of permanent residents and foreign nationals who are listed in the annual report as having been responsible for terrorist-related activities, incitement to hatred, or serious human rights violations, and amends the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act to render such persons whose actions would, if committed in Canada, have constituted an indictable offence, as well as persons who have served in the IRGC or the Basij-e Mostazafan, inadmissible under that Act.*

Oil Tanker Moratorium Act (Bill C-48) Royal Assent June 21, 2019: S.C. 2019, c. 26. *Summary: This enactment enacts the Oil Tanker Moratorium Act, which prohibits oil tankers that are carrying more than 12 500 metric tons of crude oil or persistent oil as cargo from stopping, or unloading crude oil or persistent oil, at ports or marine installations located along British Colum-*

bia's north coast from the northern tip of Vancouver Island to the Alaska border. The Act prohibits loading if it would result in the oil tanker carrying more than 12 500 metric tons of those oils as cargo. The Act also prohibits vessels and persons from transporting crude oil or persistent oil between oil tankers and those ports or marine installations for the purpose of aiding the oil tanker to circumvent the prohibitions on oil tankers. Finally, the Act establishes an administration and enforcement regime that includes requirements to provide information and to follow directions and that provides for penalties of up to a maximum of five million dollars.

Pay Equity Act (enactment)...See...Budget Implementation Act, 2018, No. 2 (Bill C-86) S.C. 2018, c. 27.

Preclearance Act, 2016 (Bill C-23) Royal Assent December 12, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 27. Act comes into force on a day or days to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2019-34) Order Fixing the Date on which the Preclearance Act, 2016 Comes into Force as the Day on which the Agreement on Land, Rail, Marine and Air Transport Preclearance between the Government of Canada and the Government of the United States of America Enters into Force — (SOR/2019-184) The schedule to the Act is amended. *Summary: This enactment implements the Agreement on Land, Rail, Marine, and Air Transport Preclearance between the Government of Canada and the Government of the United States of America (the Agreement), done at Washington on March 16, 2015, to provide for the preclearance in each country of travellers and goods bound for the other country.*

Postal Services Resumption and Continuation Act (Bill C-89) Royal Assent November 26, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 25. Act in force at noon Eastern Standard Time on the day after the day on which it receives royal assent. *Summary: This enactment provides for the resumption and continuation of postal services and imposes a mediation process to resolve matters remaining in dispute between the parties. It also empowers the mediator-arbitrator to impose an arbitration process to resolve matters that cannot be resolved through mediation.*

Poverty Reduction Act (enactment)...See...Budget Implementation Act, 2019, No. 1 (Bill C-97) S.C. 2019, c. 29.

Poverty Reduction Act (Bill C-87) Commons 1st Reading November 6, 2018. *Summary: This enactment enacts the Poverty Reduction Act, which provides for an official metric and other metrics to measure the level of poverty in Canada, sets out two poverty reduction targets in Canada and establishes the National Advisory Council on Poverty.*

Prohibiting Investments in Cluster Munitions Act (Bill S-235) Senate 2nd Reading June 13, 2017. *Summary: This enactment creates a new prohibition against investing in an entity that has breached a prohibition relating to cluster munitions, explosive submunitions and explosive bomblets.*

Recognition of Charlottetown as the Birthplace of Confederation Act (Bill S-236) Royal Assent December 12, 2017: S.C. 2017, c. 30. *Summary: This enactment recognizes Charlottetown as the birthplace of Confederation.*

- Respecting Families of Murdered and Brutalized Persons Act (Bill C-266) Commons reported without amendment June 18, 2019. *Summary: This enactment amends the Criminal Code to provide that a person convicted of the abduction, sexual assault and murder of the same victim in respect of the same event or series of events is to be sentenced to imprisonment for life without eligibility for parole until the person has served a sentence of between twenty-five and forty years as determined by the presiding judge after considering the recommendation, if any, of the jury.*
- Shared Parenting Act (Bill S-202) Senate 2nd Reading October 6, 2016. *Summary: This enactment amends the Divorce Act to provide for parenting plans that set out the responsibilities and authority of each spouse with respect to the care, development and upbringing of a child of the marriage. A parenting plan may be included in an application for a custody or access order brought by one or both spouses under the Act. The new provisions also set out the fundamental principles of shared parenting that are to be included in a parenting plan, although the court may approve a plan that does not include all the listed principles if satisfied that doing so is in the best interests of the child. The enactment also requires a court to satisfy itself that reasonable arrangements have been made for the parenting of any children of a marriage before granting a divorce under the Act.*
- Strengthening Motor Vehicle Safety for Canadians Act (Bill S-2) Royal Assent March 1, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 2. Sections 4 and 15 of the Act come into force on a day or days to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. *Summary: This enactment amends the Motor Vehicle Safety Act for the purpose of strengthening the enforcement and compliance regime to further protect the safety of Canadians and to provide additional flexibility to support advanced safety technologies and other vehicle innovations. It provides the Minister of Transport with the authority to order companies to correct a defect or non-compliance and establishes a tiered penalty structure for offences committed under the Act. The enactment also makes a consequential amendment to the Transportation Appeal Tribunal of Canada Act.*
- Supporting Vested Rights Under Access to Information Act (Bill C-52) Commons 1st Reading June 9, 2017. *Summary: This enactment, among other things, (a) amends the Ending the Long-gun Registry Act, by repealing the amendments made by the Economic Action Plan 2015 Act, No. 1, to retroactively restore the application of the Access to Information Act and the Privacy Act to the records related to the registration of non-restricted firearms until the day on which this enactment receives royal assent; (b) provides that the Access to Information Act and the Privacy Act continue to apply to proceedings that were initiated under those Acts before that day until the proceedings are finally disposed of, settled or abandoned; and (c) directs the Commissioner of Firearms to provide the minister of the Government of Quebec responsible for public security with a copy of such records, at that minister's request.*
- Tax Convention and Arrangement Implementation Act, 2016 (Bill S-4) Royal Assent December 8, 2016: S.C. 2016, c. 13; in force as set out in the Act.

Summary: This enactment implements a convention between the Government of Canada and the Government of the State of Israel for the avoidance of double taxation and the prevention of fiscal evasion with respect to taxes on income and an arrangement between the Canadian Trade Office in Taipei and the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Canada for the avoidance of double taxation and the prevention of fiscal evasion with respect to taxes on income. It also amends the Canada-Hong Kong Tax Agreement Act, 2013 to add to it, for greater certainty, an interpretation provision.

Trans Mountain Pipeline Project Act (Bill S-245) Passed Senate. Commons 1st Reading May 24, 2018. *Summary: This enactment declares the Trans Mountain Pipeline Project and related works to be works for the general advantage of Canada.*

Transportation Modernization Act (Bill C-49) Royal Assent May 23, 2018: S.C. 2018, c. 10; in force as set out in the Act — (SI/2018-50) June 27, 2018 is fixed as the day on which ss. 15, 16, 90 and 91 of the Act come into force — (SI/2018-110) December 10, 2018 is fixed as the day on which ss. 70 to 72 of the Act come into force — (SI/2019-16) April 3, 2019 is fixed as the day on which ss. 14, 78 and 83-88 of the Act come into force. *Summary: This enactment amends the Canada Transportation Act in respect of air transportation and railway transportation. With respect to air transportation, it amends the Canada Transportation Act to require the Canadian Transportation Agency to make regulations establishing a new air passenger rights regime and to authorize the Governor in Council to make regulations requiring air carriers and other persons providing services in relation to air transportation to report on different aspects of their performance with respect to passenger experience or quality of service. It amends the definition of Canadian in that Act in order to raise the threshold of voting interests in an air carrier that may be owned and controlled by non-Canadians while retaining its Canadian status, while also establishing specific limits related to such interests. It also amends that Act to create a new process for the review and authorization of arrangements involving two or more transportation undertakings providing air services to take into account considerations respecting competition and broader considerations respecting public interest.*

Underground Infrastructure Safety Enhancement Act (Bill S-229) Passed Senate May 2, 2017. *Summary: This enactment creates a federal underground infrastructure notification system that requires, among other things, (a) operators of underground infrastructure that is federally regulated or that is located on federal land to register that underground infrastructure with a notification centre and provide information on it; (b) persons planning to undertake a ground disturbance to make a locate request to the relevant notification centres; and (c) operators of registered underground infrastructure, as a result of the locate request, to mark the location of the underground infrastructure on the ground, provide in writing any other accurate and clear description of the location of the underground infrastructure or indicate that the ground disturbance is not likely to cause damage to the underground infrastructure. Finally, the enactment also provides a mechanism by which reserves and*

some other lands subject to the Indian Act can become subject to this notification system, after consultation with the council of any band in question.

United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act (Bill C-262)

Passed Commons. Senate reported without amendment June 11, 2019. *Summary: This enactment requires the Government of Canada to take all measures necessary to ensure that the laws of Canada are in harmony with the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples.*

Veterans Well-being Act (Bill C-42) Commons 1st Reading March 24, 2017.

Summary: This enactment amends the Canadian Forces Members and Veterans Re-establishment and Compensation Act to, among other things, (a) specify to whom career transition services may be provided under Part 1 of the Act and authorize the Governor in Council to make regulations respecting those services; (b) create a new education and training benefit that will provide a veteran with up to \$80,000 for a course of study at an educational institution or for other education or training that is approved by the Minister of Veterans Affairs; (c) end the family caregiver relief benefit and replace it with a caregiver recognition benefit that is payable to a person designated by a veteran; (d) authorize the Minister of Veterans Affairs to waive the requirement for an application for compensation, services or assistance under the Act in certain cases; (e) set out to whom any amount payable under the Act is to be paid if the person who is entitled to that amount dies before receiving it; and (f) change the name of the Act. The enactment also amends the Pension Act and the Department of Veterans Affairs Act to remove references to hospitals under the jurisdiction of the Department of Veterans Affairs as there are no longer any such hospitals. Finally, it makes consequential amendments to other Acts.

Voluntary Blood Donations Act (An Act to amend the Blood Regulations) (Bill

S-252) Senate 2nd Reading October 25, 2018. *Summary: This enactment amends the Blood Regulations to provide that an establishment, other than Canadian Blood Services, must not collect allogeneic blood for remuneration or benefit for the donor unless the blood collected is of a rare phenotype.*

Wrecked, Abandoned or Hazardous Vessels Act (Bill C-64) Royal Assent February

28, 2019; S.C. 2019, c. 1. The provisions of the Act, other than ss. 38, 138 and 139, come into force on a day or days to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council. Sections 38, 138 and 139 come into force on a day to be fixed by order of the Governor in Council — (SI/2019-30) July 30, 2019 is fixed as the day on which the Act comes into force. *Summary: This enactment enacts the Wrecked, Abandoned or Hazardous Vessels Act, which promotes the protection of the public, of the environment, including coastlines and shorelines, and of infrastructure by regulating abandoned or hazardous vessels and wrecks in Canadian waters and, in certain cases, Canada's ex-*

clusive economic zone, and by recognizing the responsibility and liability of owners for their vessels.
