Bangsund on the Personal Property Security Act: The CCPPSL Model is about modern Canadian provincial and territorial personal property security law under the model Personal Property Security Act promulgated by the Canadian Conference on Personal Property Security Law (“CCPPSL”). The CCPPSL Model PPSA is in force, more or less, in eleven of Canada’s thirteen provinces and territories. Only the nation’s two most populous provinces – Ontario and Quebec – have embraced other statutory models.

The CCPPSL aims “to encourage and facilitate the harmonization and compatibility of provincial, territorial and federal personal property security law” and furnishes an annual forum for the exchange of views and experiences among civil servants responsible for administering the Canadian personal property registries of all provinces and territories, legal scholars with expertise in personal property security law, and electronic registry technologists.

This edition addresses major jurisprudence in lower courts particularly respecting justifications or excuses. In 2013 the Harper Government enacted new, simplified Criminal Code provisions respecting the defences of person and property. The reform was long overdue but the new provisions have left far too many uncertainties for courts to work out such as the approach to proportionality, whether there is any duty to retreat and the extent to which the sensitivity to accused acting in abusive situations declared by the Supreme Court in Lavallee is still in place. Two jury acquittals of Caucasian men charged with the murder of Indigenous men in the name of self-defence have been highly controversial. The Manitoba and Ontario Courts of Appeal differ as to whether the defence of duress can ever be a defence to murder. Lower courts have struck down Harper amendments limiting the partial provocation defence.

This coursebook focuses on the tension between the rights of accused, especially since the Charter of Rights and Freedoms, and the interests of effective law enforcement. This fourteenth edition has been up-dated and clarified and out-of-date material excluded. We have given full consideration to the following recent major rulings from the Supreme Court.

- *Le* – Racial context and profiling ; s.24(2) exclusion for Charter breaches
- *Chouhan* – Challenging potential jurors for cause
- *K.G.K* – Jordan ceilings not applying to verdict delay respecting s. 11(b)

An important focus was to incorporate and assess the response of the Federal Government to the much tougher approach to unconstitutional delay by the Supreme Court in *R. v. Jordan* and what the Court saw as a “culture of complacency”. Bill C-75 was passed by the House of Commons in December of 2018. In the case of jury selection, the Act abolishes peremptory challenges and declares that challenges for cause is a matter for judicial discretion. Special attention is given to the Supreme Court’s lengthy and deeply divided decision in *R v. Chouhan* as to how judges are expected to approach their new and wide responsibility to control juror selection through challenges for cause. There is an expanded but unclear judicial duty to explore possible biases.

Full consideration is also given to the 3-2 decision of the Supreme Court in *R. v. Le* respecting arbitrary detention in a racialized context. This is now clearly the leading decision on how race is to be considered in the separate inquiries into whether there has been psychological detention and/or racial profiling. The majority decision in *Le* also adds weight to the established approach of the Supreme Court to exclusion of evidence under s. 24(2) of the Charter.
